Cultural Plunge Activity

Goal of the Cultural Plunge Activity

• The goal of the Cultural Plunge Activity is to enhance students' multicultural competencies.

Objectives of the Cultural Plunge Activity:

- After completing the assignment, students will enhance their multicultural competencies by:
 - 1. Developing self-awareness of one's own cultures.
 - 2. Acquiring knowledge of others' cultures.
 - 3. Obtaining skills in counseling or educating diverse clients.

Genre:



- Newsletter
 - Newsletters are commonly used by nonprofits to increase awareness of a population, service, and/or need and to build support for their missions. The purpose of this newsletter is to increase awareness of an Irish institution, a cultural group, or a human services program in Ireland.
 - The newsletter is your chance to share your thoughts and feelings about your Cultural Plunge Experience in a creative and artistic format.
 - Your newsletter should educate, inform, influence, advocate, and connect the readers to your experiences.
 - It is meant to illustrate your understanding of cultural differences and how the experience of the cultural plunge affects your ideas and future work with diverse populations.
 - Consider if and how what you have experienced and learned changes your thinking and understanding about cultural differences and how this may affect your work as a human service professional.

Role:

• The role or purpose of the Cultural Plunge Activity is to enhance students' multicultural competencies and to educate others on diversity issues and multicultural understanding.

Audience:

- Although your instructor and the GTA for this course will be reading and grading your paper, this
 newsletter should be written as though the audience is unfamiliar with the population and the
 Cultural Plunge you experienced. The audience, therefore, is the general community. If you
 write the newsletter as if the instructor and the GTA are the audience, you may not say as much
 as you should or say it as clearly as you should because you assume the instructor and GTA are
 more knowledgeable about the facts and will fill in the gaps. Thinking about your audience
 differently can improve your writing, especially in terms of how clearly you describe your
 experience and learnings. Write your newsletter as if your audience is unfamiliar with the
 population and the Cultural Plunge you experienced. The following questions can help address
 what may be the needs and wants of your audience:
 - Who is your audience?
 - Does the Cultural Plunge Activity give you any clues to your audience?
 - What does your audience want, value, and need?
 - What is most important to your audience?
 - What is your audience least likely to care about?

- What kind of organization would best help your audience understand and appreciate your experience?
- What portion of what you learned through your Cultural Plunge Activity might surprise your audience?
- What do you want your audience to learn, think, or assume about your Cultural Plunge Activity?

Format:

- Write and create a 3 to 5-page, typed, double-spaced newsletter.
- Use the first person singular ("I") and relate your Cultural Plunge Experience to your previous readings, knowledge, and experiences.
- Review these Cultural Plunge Experience instructions to be sure you've included all the relevant information needed in your newsletter.
- Give your Cultural Plunge Experience newsletter structure by including the following elements:
 - Headline: Create a catchy headline that uses a larger size font to attract the audience's attention.
 - Byline: Found near the top of the newsletter. It is your name and location (city, state).
 - Lead paragraph: The first paragraph should contain the Who, What, Where, and When of the Cultural Plunge Experience. It should summarize the experience and hook the reader into wanting to read more.
 - Body paragraphs: The following paragraphs should describe the "why" of the article/newsletter. It should include background information and additional details that the audience might want to know.
 - Wrap-up: The newsletter should end with concluding remarks that leave the reader with a great understanding and appreciate for the Irish institution, cultural group, or human services program in Ireland.
- Include photos, illustrations, and/or other visually appealing components in your Newsletter. You want the newsletter to be visually appealing to catch the attention of the audience. Be creative!

- Cultural Plunge Activity:
 - Students will choose a type of Irish institution, a cultural group, or a human services program in Ireland with whom they are not familiar.

Some Examples:

- Travellers
- Persons who are in poverty
- Rural persons (e.g., small farmers)
- Religious groups
- Recent immigrants
- Protestants (Loyalists) or Catholics (Nationalists) in Northern Ireland
- Corrections programs
- Drug/alcohol rehab
- Domestic violence
- Career assistance
- Pastoral counseling
- Community mental health agency
- Private practice/family/couples counseling
- Homelessness program
- Youth program (residential/non-residential)
- Immigrant program
- University counseling center
- Social services
- Africans in Ireland
- Caribbean people in Ireland
- Middle Easterners in Ireland
- Asians of various subgroups in Ireland
- Individuals with disabilities (preferably visible disabilities) in Ireland
- Lesbians and/or Gay men in Ireland
- Transgendered persons in Ireland
- After choosing an Irish institution, a cultural group, or a human services program in Ireland, students will make contact with the co-leader of the Ireland Summer Institute, Dr. Laurie Craigen, no later than July 15, 2014, and provide her with information regarding the Irish institution, cultural group, or human services program the student is interested in

Task:

exploring. Dr. Craigen will contact the Irish representatives from USIT for help in making contact with the group.

- After making contact with the group, students, as described below, will conduct an interview with one member of the group on specifically someone for whom that group membership is important, about their experience as a member of that group. The interview will take place on August 11, 2014.
- Following the interview students will join that person for a *one-hour experience* with that Irish institution, cultural group, or human services program (e.g., a social event, a tour, a religious service, a meeting, a festival, a gathering, an extended family experience). The experience will take place on August 11, 2014.
- Following the experience, and if time permits, students will report on their experiences to the Institute participants. Students will share key facts, thoughts, and feelings about the plunge experience with the group (i.e., students will describe their experiences and the impact the experiences had on them).
- Students will write a 3 to 5-page, double-spaced newsletter and submit the paper using the "Submissions" link in Blackboard no later than August 20 at 11pm (EST). Students can and should use first person ("I") in their newsletters. The newsletters must be free of spelling and grammatical errors. The newsletters must comment on:
- \circ $\;$ The Cultural Plunge Experience and interview in terms of:
 - What stood out for you about the experience?
 - What was the impact of and learning as a result of the cultural plunge experience?
 - What did you learn about yourself as an individual, including the emotional and interpersonal dimensions of the trip?
 - What did you learn about other cultures?
 - What did you learn about your own culture?

Why is this relevant to the students (See purpose/role)?:

• The cultural plunge assignment is relevant to students because it is essential that students empathically experience newness in the form of different and non-dominant cultures or social programs so that students can relativize their own cultural norms and learn about a specific group.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Conducting an interview with a member of an Irish institution, a cultural group, or a human services program in Ireland. 5 points
- Joining the interviewee for a one-hour experience with an Irish institution, a cultural group, or a human services program in Ireland. 5 points
- Writing and creating a 3 to 5-page newsletter following the formatting instructions and including all required components of the newsletter as previously stated. 20 points

Submission Guidelines:

• Students will submit their newsletter through the "Submissions" link on Blackboard. The link will be available from August 16 at 12midnight (EST) until August 19 at 11pm (EST). The link will not be available after August 19 at 11pm. Include appropriate citations for all materials referenced from other sources.
